Canal	Man-made waterway constructed to allow the passage of boats or to carry water.
Isthmus	Narrow strip of land connecting two larger land masses.
Archipelago	Group of islands.
Butte	Isolated hill with steep sides and a flat top.
Waterfall	Cascade of water falling from a height.
Scree	Accumulation of loose rocks and debris on a mountain slope.
Valley	Low area of land between hills or mountains.
Alluvial Fan	Cone-shaped deposit of sediment left by a stream.
Rapids	Fast flowing and agitated part of a river.
Glacier	Large body of ice moving slowly down a slope.
Volcano	Mountain or hill with a vent through which lava escapes from the earth's crust.
Mesa	Isolated flat-topped elevation that rises abruptly from the surrounding area.
Range	Series of connected mountains.
Sand Dune	Ridge of sand created by the wind.
Sea	Large body of water partially enclosed by land (smaller than an ocean).
Bluff	High steep bank by a river or sea.
Geyser	Spring that throws forth jets of hot water and steam.
Atoll	Ring shaped reef formed from coral.
